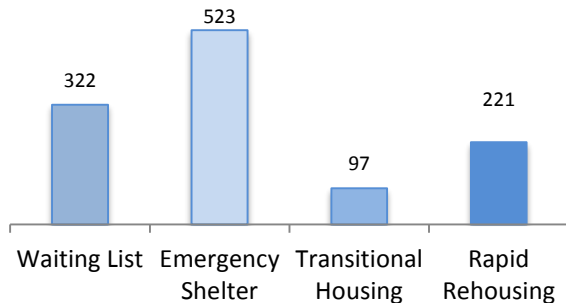

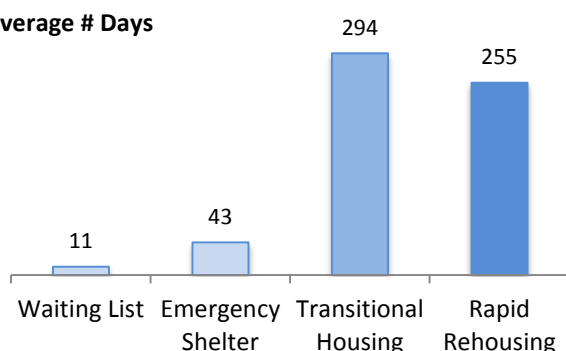

## TYPE & DURATION OF HOUSING

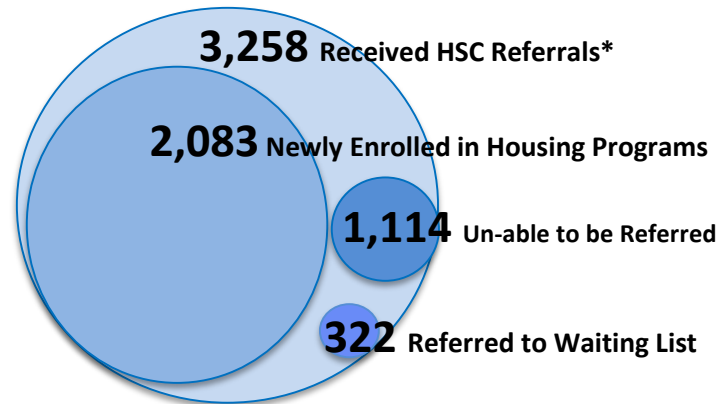

## HOUSEHOLDS ASSISTED

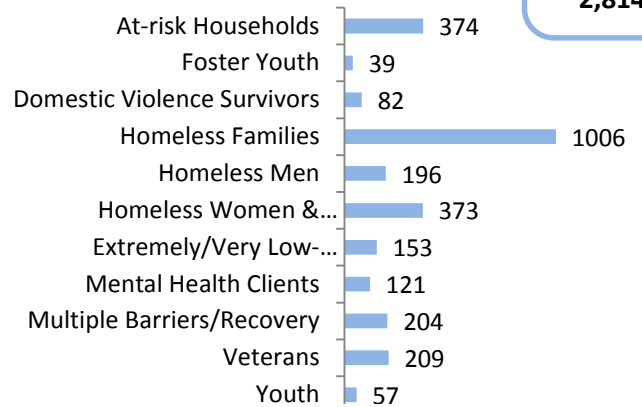
