

## Participate

- Find volunteer opportunities to help people living homeless, visit [volunteerkitsap.org](http://volunteerkitsap.org)
- Contact your local food bank and ask what items of food are needed the most for the homeless or plant a row for the hungry in your home garden and donate to your local food bank.
- Organize a drive for white tube socks at your church or club and give to any of the groups listed (except #4, #9, #13, & #14).
- Volunteer your time and talent at any of the organizations listed.
- Organize a community food drive for your local food bank. Give non-perishable items, canned foods, pop-top cans, energy bars and water.
- Every school district has a "Homeless Liaison" who works with their kids. Call your district's administration office to connect with them and ask them what they need to help their students stay in and succeed at school.
- Volunteer at Kitsap County Severe Weather Shelters, <http://kcowa.us/kcsws> and the Point-in-Time Count, <http://kcowa.us/kitsap-pit> or call (360) 337-7287
- Volunteer at Dayroom at the Kitsap Rescue Mission (#7) visit [www.kitsaprescue.org](http://www.kitsaprescue.org).
- Help prepare and serve evening meals for 24 single homeless men at Benedict House (#1).
- Volunteer your time at Helpline House (#3) on Bainbridge Island.
- Prepare a welcome basket for families moving in to housing to lessen the initial burden of setting up their home. For example: towels, washcloths, dish soap & scrubber, laundry detergent, hygiene products, condiments. Contact Housing Resources Bainbridge at (206) 842-1909.
- Help with local litter cleanup projects or have a supply assembly party with Northwest Hospitality (888) 222-5240.
- Volunteer at the YWCA (#17) as a legal or shelter advocate, or in outreach/admin positions.

## Advocate and Educate

- Invite someone from the Kitsap Housing and Homelessness Coalition to speak at your civic group or organization's meeting to learn more about homelessness.
- Work to dispel the myths about those who don't have a home to call their own.
- Suggest to your faith-based organization that special collections be designated to organizations in their region or community providing aid to people who are homeless.
- Know where to refer people who are homeless for services. Dial 2-1-1 or contact the Housing Solutions Center (#4).

# How You Can Help People Living Homeless

No matter what your skills, age or resources, there are ways you can make a difference for people who are living homeless.



Kitsap County has thousands of homeless men, women, children, and infants, many of whom can use some help.

**“How can I help?”**

**Here are some ideas:**

## Donate

- Buy bus tokens from Kitsap Transit (40 for \$40) and donate them to the organizations listed. Call the Transit Finance Dept. at (360) 478-6234.
- Donate gas cards to all the organizations listed so folks can get to work, case management, training, doctor, meal sites, etc.
- Taking It To The Streets Ministries (#14), Kitsap Rescue Mission (#7), Coffee Oasis (#2) and Salvation Army (#10) and Fishline (#9) need sleeping bags, tents and tarps, and outdoor gear for homeless youth and adults.
- Donate your gently used clothing and household items to Abraham’s House which provides them to families in need. (360) 405-0488.
- Donate gift cards to any of the organizations listed (except #15).
- Donate money to Taking It To The Streets Ministries (#14) to pay for families to stay at Illahee State Park.
- Add a donation to your monthly YMCA membership dues to sponsor children in the Y’s Strong Kids Campaign, (360) 377-0522.
- Donate personal hygiene items such as toothbrush/paste, deodorant, tampons/pads, shampoo/conditioner, to organizations including (#1, #8, #10, #11), Northwest Hospitality (888) 222-5240 and Agape Unlimited (360) 373-1529.
- Donate new or gently used bedding, comforters, blankets and pillows to Agape Unlimited for residents transitioning out of homelessness. (360) 373-1529.
- Fishline (#9) needs gift cards for Subway, and Taco Time for homeless clients. Donate beef jerky, peanut butter, nuts, spam, can openers, nail clippers, small jars & coffee packets.



- Donate flashlights, batteries, portable heaters, hand-crank lanterns to Kitsap Rescue Mission (#7), The Salvation Army (#10) or Taking It To The Streets Ministries (#14).
- Coffee Oasis (#2) provides shower access for youth and others. Donate travel-size bath soaps, shampoos and conditioners.
- YWCA ALIVE DV shelter (#17) needs gift cards, pajamas, underwear, toilet paper & paper towels, and cleaning supplies.
- Donate to the Peninsula Community Health Services’ “Willow Fund” to help cover medical costs for qualifying homeless persons. Call (360) 478-2366 or [www.pchswb.org/donate](http://www.pchswb.org/donate) for details.
- Coffee Oasis Teen Center (#2) needs bags of cookies, snacks, Cup ‘O Soups, granola bars, paper towels & toilet paper.
- Bremerton’s Renaissance Alternative High School needs women’s tennis shoes size 5 to 9, men’s size 8 to 13 and socks. Call Administration for details at (360) 473-1080.
- Donate a roll of quarters to the Max Hale Center’s (#8) laundry fund to help residents with this expense.
- Donate food to First Christian Church in Port Orchard for their “Back Pack Friday” program where food is sent home for the weekend. (360) 876-8172.
- Kitsap Rescue Mission (#7) needs grocery store gift cards to purchase food for meals.
