Bar Complaints

To the best of my recollection, I have received 3 bar complaints. I do not have a copy of either complaint.

- In Approximately 1988, I was a deputy prosecuting attorney in Jefferson County. I prosecuted a
 young man for murder. After being sentenced, the father made false allegations that I was
 overzealous without investigation.
- 2. In Approximately 1995, I successfully represented a father in a child support modification. He complained that bills failed to credit payments. After responding that bills only showed activity for the previous month and that payments made after the first of the month would appear as credits on that month's bill, the current apologized and withdrew his complaint.

MALPRACTICE SUITS

Zwicker v Olsen & McFadden, Kitsap County Superior Court No. 10-2-02887-2. The client missed the statute of limitations after I advised him of the incorrect statute. The case was settled by our insurer.

CLAIMS OF IMPROPER FEE CHARGES

2019 Haver/ Triller Dissolution, Kitsap County Superior Court No. 15-3-00834-5 Father has contested the Custody Modification case and opposed approval of my GAL fees; arguing that my fees exceeded Court Ordered Cap and that my investigation included issues beyond those raised in his Petition. The court approved my fees as requested.

2022, Jensen v. Lupfer #12-3-00772-7 Father disputed GAL's report, recommendations & fees, claiming numerous factual inaccuracies. The court found 2 minor errors & ordered GAL to revise the sealed report to correct them. The court found that the father's remaining claims constituted disagreement about contested facts. GAL did not violate ethical rules. GAL fees were approved.
