How to vote this ballot

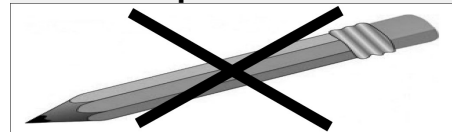

Bainbridge Island Metropolitan Park & Recreation District Proposition No. 1
<p>Levy Lid Lift to Restore the Regular Property Tax Levy The Board of Commissioners of Bainbridge Island Metropolitan Park & Recreation District has adopted Resolution 2021-01 concerning restoring the regular property tax levy to its original rate.</p> <p>If approved, this proposition would restore the 2022 levy rate to \$0.75/\$1,000 to fund maintenance, repairs, renovations, operations, programming, and public use and access to District properties. For 2023-2027, the limit factor for calculating increases would equal inflation, measured by CPI-W. Qualifying low-income seniors and persons with disabilities would be exempt from the increases.
