Primary Election – September 16, 2003

Note To Voters:

- This ballot contains all measures and races that will appear on the September 16, 2003, Primary Election ballot. Only the ballot issues that apply to the precinct where you are registered to vote will be counted.
- Regular polling locations will not be open, your ballot must be post-marked no later than September 16, 2003, or taken to a ballot drop-off location on Election Day between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. If you have any questions about voting call the County Elections Division at (360) 337.7128.
- NP next to a candidate's name indicates Non Partisan.

To Vote: Use a #2 pencil to complete the arrow pointing to your choice. Use one single line to complete the arrow. If voting for a candidate NOT on the ballot, connect the arrow and write in the name of the candidate and the party affiliation in the space provided.



Marking Your Ballot ...

Voted ballots are read electronically so any extraneous marks on the ballot result in hand processing.

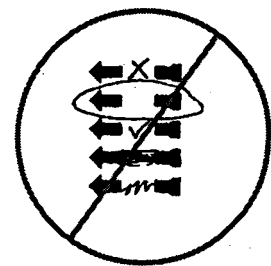
Follow these tips for marking your ballot:

Proposition No. 1 General Obligation Bonds - \$60,000,000	
The Board of Directors of Central Kitsap School District No. 401 adopted Resolution No. 26-02-03 concerning a proposition for bonds. The proposition authorizes the District to replace Central Kitsap and Fairview Junior High Schools, and replace Jackson Park and Seabeck Elementary Schools; to issue \$60,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 17 years; and to levy excess property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as provided in Resolution No. 26-02-03.
