Harmful organisms can be transmitted from dog waste to children. Some can persist for weeks in your yard, waiting for a host.

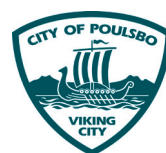
Landfills are designed to safely handle substances like dog waste. Yards and septic systems are not. Burying or composting pet waste allows harmful organisms into groundwater.
