### Bremerton Transportation Benefit District

#### Proposition No. 1

#### Annual Vehicle Fee for Transportation Improvement Program

The Governing Board of the Bremerton Transportation Benefit District of the City of Bremerton, Washington, adopted [Resolution No. 002](#) concerning the imposition of an annual vehicle fee to finance transportation improvements. This proposition would authorize an annual vehicle fee in the amount of thirty dollars (\$30.00) to be imposed and collected within the District in accordance with RCW 82.80.140 for a term of three years to be collected as soon as authorized by law for the purpose of paying the costs of transportation improvement projects identified in Ordinance No. 5076 creating the Transportation Benefit District and Bremerton Transportation Benefit District Resolution No. 002. Should this proposition be approved?

### Bainbridge Island School District No. 303

#### Proposition No. 1

#### General Obligation Bonds – \$42,000,000

The Board of Directors of Bainbridge Island School District No. 303 approved [Resolution 14-08-09](#) concerning a proposition to finance school renovations and improvements. If approved, this proposition will authorize the District to renovate and upgrade school buildings including roofs, heating systems, classroom equipment, safety and security systems; improve energy conservation; replace Wilkes Elementary School and complete other capital improvements to District facilities; to issue \$42,000,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 20 years; and to levy additional property taxes annually to repay the bonds, as described in Resolution 14-08-09. ### Bainbridge Island Fire Department

#### Proposition No. 1

#### Proposition Authorizing Regular Emergency Medical Services Property Tax Levy

The Board of Commissioners of the Bainbridge Island Fire Department adopted [Resolution No. 17-2009](#) concerning a proposition to impose an emergency medical services property tax levy. This proposition would authorize the Board of Commissioners to fund emergency medical services for its citizens by imposing a regular property tax levy of \$.40 or less per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for a period of ten consecutive years beginning in 2009 for collection in 2010. Should this proposition be enacted into law?

For approval, at least 3,810 must vote yes if fewer than 40% (6,350) turn out to vote. If more than 40% (6,350) turn out to vote, 60% or more of those voting must vote YES for the measure to pass.
