Mission

Kitsap County established the Suquamish Citizen Advisory Committee (SCAC) in 2006 to actively facilitate communication among the Suquamish community; mutually develop and promote a sense of community vision and pride; communicate to the County, Suquamish Tribe, and other government entities the desires and concerns of the Suquamish community; and bring to the Suquamish community issues and projects of the County and Suquamish Tribe, and provide a means for receiving and conveying to the County and Suquamish Tribe the community's response.
