10:05) Continuation of the **Closed Record** hearing to consider an [Appeal](#) filed by **James and Sharon Stritzel** of the Hearing Examiner's decision to deny the request for a **"Stop Work Order"** posted by Kitsap County Department of Community Development Building Division (issued as a result of a significant mudslide from the Stritzel property that damaged multiple downstream properties as well as the County Right-of-way and storm water system) on property located at 7742 East Spruce Street in South Kitsap Commissioner District #2. **Staff Contact:** Mike Barth, 337-4968. **(NOTE: Said Matter for Decision Only. No testimony will be taken).**

Commissioner Angel states she has reviewed the file as well as the videos relative to the mudslide. She said she could not find any proof of the issues raised by the Stritzel's in their appeal.

A **motion** is made by Commissioner Angel and seconded by Commissioner Bauer that the Board deny the appeal and further, request that the Hearing Examiner affirms the "stop work" order posted by the Department of Community Development Building Official; affirms that the placement of "fill" materials was in violation of Kitsap County Code; affirms that a Site Development Activity Permit along with plans designated by a professional engineer is required to correct the dangerous conditions; and affirms that as result of the violation, a mud slide occurred causing considerable damage to numerous down stream properties. Motion carries unanimously.

10:10) Public hearing to consider enacting an [Ordinance](#) to amend the Kitsap County Comprehensive Plan, area-specific Kingston Sub-Area Plan, 6-Year Capital Facility Plan and Kingston Wastewater Facility Plan as it relates to sewer provision and future wastewater conveyance in the Kingston urban growth area (UGA). This proposal is related to a Central Puget Sound Growth Management Hearing Board order of continuing non-compliance, *KCRP VI v. Kitsap County*, CPSGMHB case # 06-3-007 (3/16/07). **Staff Contact:** Angie Silva, 337-4841.

Eric Baker, Commissioners Office, gave an over view of the proposed ordinance stating

the documents before the Board are meant to address particular items associated with the appeals to the Central Puget Sound Growth Management Hearings Board and their remanded issues to the county. He said the county through its 10-year update attempted to address a series of these issues and successfully dealt with three of the items. Baker said the fourth item, the lack of adequate sewer capacity and sewer planning for the Kingston Urban Growth Area was again remanded to the county with an order of partial invalidity. From a decision made earlier this year, Baker said the Board of Commissioners recommended that staff produce additional capital facilities planning in the area of new pump stations as well as the locations of potential trunk lines through out the urban growth area. He said there is a series of areas within the existing Kingston Urban Growth Area that does not have existing sewer service. He said there are no existing main lines and no existing pump stations located largely in the southern portion of the Kingston Urban Growth Area along with some other urban restricted areas in the Carpenter Lake and Washington Blvd area. He said the county updated the 1995 Kingston Waste Water Plan to augment the existing sewer plan showing pump stations and trunk lines in all of these areas. He said the Plan also addressed the alternate sewer technologies that are represented repeatedly in the Comprehensive Plan as another option for sewer provision for the county's urban growth area. Baker said by showing how the county can provide trunk lines and pump stations in these areas of inadequate sewer provision and combined with opportunities for water recharge in the alternate sewer technologies, the county has shown in the Kingston Urban Growth Area how over the course of the next 20 years, it will be able to adequately serve the urban growth to its urban densities. Relative to financing for the pump stations and trunk lines, Baker said it includes reallocation of revenue from other sources, utility local improvement districts and developer extensions and additional state and federal grants.

Discussion is held regarding the deadline from the Hearings Board, Kingston Citizens Advisory Committee meeting, Advisory Committee not included in the subsequent planning process regarding the information to be sent to the Hearings Board and a request for 30-day extension.

Lisa Nickels, Prosecutor's Office, said prior to her commenting, the Board need to waive its attorney/client privilege for the limited purpose of her sharing this information.

A **motion** is made by Commissioner Angel and seconded by Commissioner Bauer that the Board waives its attorney/client privilege thereby allowing Lisa Nickels for the limited purpose, to share research results as it relates to the likelihood of being granted an extension. Motion carries unanimously.

Nickels said essentially what she found was that any request would be denied. She said the Growth Board has received a few requests in the past for extensions and they have been denied indicating that the Growth Management Act gives the Growth Board 180 days for scheduling compliance matters unless a case has already been determined to be complex by the Growth Board. She said the Growth Board did not determine this case to be complex thus it gave Kitsap County the full 180 days and does not feel it has the authority to go beyond those days . Nickels said it was stated in those opinions that the only way to

receive more time is for the county, city or other local jurisdictions to stipulate to non-compliance and then the Board would set another 180 day compliance schedule.

Jerry Harless said he is one of two petitioners in the Growth Hearings Board case that applies to Kingston. He said he does not have an opinion on the 30-day extension and he would not object to it.

Chair Brown closes the public comment portion of the hearing.
