10: 05) Public hearing to consider enacting an [Ordinance](#) to amend Kitsap County Code Section 2.02.010 changing the times of the regular business meeting of the Board of County Commissioners **from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month**, except for state holidays, effective with the November 5, 2007 meeting. **Staff Contact:** Nancy Grennan, 337-4403.

Nancy Grennan, County Administrator, gave a brief overview of the proposed ordinance.

Vivian Henderson, Chris Danielson, Tom Donnelly, Jim Sommerhauser and Linda Cazin

spoke in support of the proposed regular business meeting time change.

Discussion is held, comments called for and hearing no objection, a **motion** is made by Commissioner Bauer and seconded by Commissioner Angel that the Board enacts **Ordinance No. 396-2007**** amending Kitsap County Code Section 2.02.010 changing the times of the regular business meeting of the Board of County Commissioners from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month, except for state holidays, effective with the November 5, 2007 meeting. Motion carries unanimously.

10:10) Closed Record hearing to consider an **Appeal** filed by **Warwick and Janice Bryant** of the Hearing Examiner's decision to deny the Conditional Use Permit application to operate their business (**Kiwi Fencing**) and its associated storage yard on the B & F Arena parcel located at 5867 Dogwood Road in South Kitsap, Commissioner District #2. **Staff Contact:** Dennis Oost, 337-7027.

Commissioner Angel states the following: The attorney for the Kiwi Fencing appellants has filed an application for a revision to the existing Unclassified Use Permit for the B & F Arena to allow for the contractor storage yard. He has also requested a continuance of the current hearing of the appeal before the Board. Staff has accepted the application and requests the Board continue the hearing to consider the appeal at a future date, preferably at least 4 months from today to allow for processing the current request for revision of the existing permit.

A **motion** is made by Commissioner Angel and seconded by Commissioner Bauer that the Board continues the Kiwi Fencing Closed Record hearing on appeal until January 21, 2008. Motion carries unanimously.

10:15) Consideration of adopting an Emergency Ordinance imposing a moratorium on certain new development in five of the urban growth areas expanded in the county's updated 2006 comprehensive plan (Maps of the affected locations are available at the front counter of Kitsap County Department of Community Development in Port Orchard, WA, or on line at www.kitsapgov.com/dcd/). **Staff Contact:** Larry Keeton, 7181.

Larry Keeton, Director of Community Development, said at issue is the Central Puget Sound Growth Management Hearings Board invalidation of the expansion of the Urban Growth Areas (UGA) for Silverdale, Central Kitsap, West Bremerton, Gorst and Port Orchard. In the original appeal to the Growth Management Hearings Board, Keeton said the urban growth areas were challenged on the basis of inadequate wastewater facilities plans. The Hearings Board invalidated the Capital Facilities Plan but did not address the size of the UGA's. In a motion for reconsideration, the petitioners argued that an invalid Capital Facilities Plan should also invalidate expanded areas or the urban growth areas. The Hearings Board agreed and thus the subsequent decision, effective September 14, 2007. The Hearings Board further clarified that only the sewer element of the County's Capital Facilities Plan was invalid. Keeton said to minimize financial loss and to give staff time to develop an appropriate response to the Growth Management

Board's order, staff is seeking a moratorium on the acceptance of new applications for development permits in the 2006 "Expansion Areas" for the following UGA's: Silverdale, Central Kitsap, West Bremerton, Gorst and Port Orchard. He said the proposed moratorium establishes a public hearing to be conducted within the next 60 days and declares this as an emergency action. He further notes this proposed action is not a public hearing at this time. Keeton said the moratorium does not prohibit those applications/permits that were received prior to September 14, 2007 and are deemed complete; permits for construction for a single family residence for owner's/lessee's use; permits related to remodeling, tenant improvements and/or expansion of an existing structure on the lot prior to September 14, 2007; and a boundary line adjustment or division of land that does not increase the number of buildable lots existing before September 14, 2007. Keeton said while the moratorium is set for 180 days, staff hopes to reach resolution with the Growth Management Hearings Board sooner. He said if so, staff recommends lifting the moratorium as soon as possible after reaching agreement with the Board. He said in the meantime, the county is pursuing sewer planning for the existing and expanded UGA's and working to clarify the Hearings Board's intentions and expectations.

Nancy Grennan, County Administrator, said this is an emergency ordinance and the proper legal notice was not given for a regular public hearing, the Board however, may receive comments today but these comments cannot substitute for a later public hearing on this matter.

William Palmer said he is a land use consultant and represents several clients that would be affected by this proposed moratorium. He said the imposition of such a possible moratorium is at best an ill-conceived, "knee-jerk" reaction and at worst a severe penalty for those who rely on county planning decisions to make investments in property. He said there is no need for a moratorium and he opposes such a measure.

Mark Kuhlman, Team 4 Engineering, believes moratoriums in general are bad business and in this case the worse possible thing about this moratorium is that it has connotations acknowledging that the county has not done its job right. He believes this is a bad message to send to the public.

Teresa Osinski, Homebuilders Association, said the Association opposes moratoriums. She said it is encouraging to think there are viable alternatives to this moratorium and asks the Board to think seriously before it takes action today. She asks the Board to listen carefully to the people that work in the industry, to their interpretations of what the codes and laws are.

Richard Brown said the county needs to take into consideration pending annexation applications which has not been done. He said any area that has current utilities that was destined to be in the urban growth area or if utilities can be brought to the areas should be left out of any moratorium. Brown said he sat on both the Buildable Lands Committee and the Sub-Area Plan Committee and both committees asked for this information but the county did not provide it.

Jon Johnson believes this is a challenge for the county yet thanks the Board for the leadership it has taken. He believes a moratorium is a “throw back”, an over reaction and it sends a message outside the county that Kitsap County is not doing a good job and he did not believe that to be true. He urges the county to continue to work in a collaborative manner and not over react.

Gary Anderson encourages the Board to make it a part of the county’s process to associate Gorst with the City of Bremerton so that it can move forward and expand.

Frank McHaffrey believes many alternative options have been shared, that a moratorium is a very dangerous thing and at minimum individuals that already have infrastructure in place or are willing to pay for infrastructure should be allowed to go forward with their applications.

Paul Mauer said it is surprising to see that everyone is penalized in this situation even though only some areas do not have infrastructure but again there are lot of areas such as his that does have the infrastructure available. He said each week and month that pass they are losing tens of thousands of dollars. He said this is extremely bad for business people and it also shows that Kitsap County is not a good place to invest your money or provide jobs. He agrees that there are options.

Fred Depee said he does believe there is a need for a moratorium but if the county does impose a moratorium, it should specify exactly what it is for. He suggests putting together a group to work on the specifics of this moratorium.

Tom Donnelly believes a moratorium is in the best interest of the taxpayers of Kitsap County as it gives an opportunity to make sense of how Kitsap County will implement the Growth Management Act. He believes there is a problem on how the UGA’s are implemented and there is a need to develop a coherent plan to provide capital facilities, particularly sewers.

Linda Cazin supports the moratorium and believes Kitsap County needs to figure out where it is going.

Vivian Henderson, Kitsap Alliance of Property Owners, questions how this moratorium will affect the price of homes and said she cannot imagine that this moratorium would make home prices better. She believes the county is getting a reputation among developers that this is not a good place to do business. Henderson said if there is a solution other than a moratorium, she urges the Board to get together with the folks that made the suggestions and come up with a better plan.

Jim Sommerhauser encourages the Board to do something to protect the taxpayers because if the county is sued, the taxpayers will pay the bill. He supports a moratorium today in order to protect all residents but as soon as possible encourages the Board to find some interim steps that protects the developer’s investments as well as the taxpayers.

Chris Danielson said if there is another alternative to this moratorium and the Board adopts this emergency moratorium, questions what types of lawsuits would be brought against the county. She said it would be a very severe detriment to the taxpayers whether the lawsuits prevailed or not.

Charlie Burrow said relative to finances, if the county does not take action, it might be seen as a defying the Hearings Board order and thus risk sanctions from the state. He said the county could lose money by not complying with the Hearings Board order and that needs to be considered.

Michelle McFadden, representing Delilah Renee, said she supports the moratorium due to earlier experiences with Renee's property and also because she does not believe the county has a choice. She said the county does not have the authority to have zoning that is inconsistent with the county's Comprehensive Plan.

Discussion is held between the Board and staff regarding interim zoning regulations, the length of time it would take to prepare interim zoning regulations, possibly asking for modifications from the Growth Hearings Board, pending annexation issues, county having no choice but to act on the moratorium, associating Gorst with the Bremerton area, the Board acting as quickly as possible to come up with a better plan rather than just a blanket moratorium, a more specific sewer plan for the Kingston area, importance of infrastructure, possibly creating an infrastructure task force with the cities, impacts to individuals who have made investments relying on the county's plan and an element of risk for everyone if the county continues without the moratorium, frustrated by the process and the Growth Management Hearings Board ruling.

A **motion** is made by Commissioner Angel and seconded by Commissioner Bauer that the Board enacts **Emergency Ordinance No. 397-2007**** imposing a moratorium on certain new development in five of the urban growth areas expanded in the county's updated 2006 Comprehensive Plan and further that a public hearing be held on or before November 5, 2007 with recommendations from staff regarding available alternatives and how to best solve the problem. Motion carries unanimously.
