## Meeting Minutes

April 15, 2009

### **I. Call to order**

President Bob Moyer called to order the regular meeting of the Central Kitsap Community Council at 7:15 PM on April 15, 2009 in the Water and Fire District Community Room, 5300 N.W. Newberry Hill Road, Silverdale, Washington.

- A. **Mary Earl** announced the April 24<sup>th</sup> Earth Day events with support from a number of local businesses and community groups.
- B. **Carol Smiley** thanked CKCC Councilmember Michael Simpkins for inviting and arranging for the CKCC members to travel aboard the USS Lincoln from Everett to Bremerton on April 10<sup>th</sup>.
- C. **Sue Fox** spoke about the new location of the Kitsap Visitors & Convention Bureau in Silverdale.
- D. **Laura Fedorko** mentioned that the overpass painting will be June 1<sup>st</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> with help received from Ken Burdette via the President's Project fund and from Rotary Duck Bucks.
- E. **Commissioner Brown** said the KC Visitors Bureau usually collects 50% of the County's lodging tax dollars. That was reduced and moving to Silverdale was a way for them to streamline costs. He also mentioned that his staff will be putting out a Quarterly Report with updates on land use, long range planning, sewers, parks and departmental news.

- F. **Bob Moyer** talked about the Kitsap County Domestic Violence Task Force Board, internet stalking and about a fundraiser on April 20<sup>th</sup> for that board.
- G. **Natalie Bryson** spoke about the Kitsap Historical Society and the antique show to be held on April 25<sup>th</sup>.
