I am writing to express the support of the Greater Hansville Area Advisory Council for the grant application submitted to the State Recreation and Conservation Office by Kitsap County Parks and Recreation for the development of Norwegian Point Park (08-1349).

Norwegian Point Park is located in the heart of Hansville and provides a much needed public beach access opportunity for the many Greater Hansville and Kitsap County residents who do not live on waterfront property or have easy beach access.

This grant will provide for the development of the park into a facility where people can come to experience Puget Sound; from the small stream flowing into the Sound, to beach life, marine wildlife, marine traffic, and views of the bluffs of Whidbey Island and mountains of the North Cascades. **FYI ONLY: Final "Description" of the grant application**  
08-1349 Norwegian Point Park Development Phase 1, WWRP-Water Access, \$490K

Norwegian Point Park is a five-acre site located on the western Puget Sound shoreline in north Kitsap County. The scope of this project is the development of the park shoreline for water-related outdoor recreational activities that include swimming, fishing, beach combing, bird watching, walking and boating. Upland elements include picnic sites and tables, open play meadow, parking, benches, accessible paths and a meandering creek with vegetation for wildlife viewing. Norwegian Point Park is the eastern terminus of the four-mile Hansville Greenway Trail that connects to the western shore of Hood Canal. The park was acquired in 2005 with ALEA match funds as one of the last remaining waterfront areas for public recreational access in the Kitsap regional area.
