

2009 WALL OF FAME RECOGNITION AWARDS

The Kitsap County Council for Human Rights and the Board of County Commissioners are currently accepting nominations for the 2009 Wall of Fame Recognition Awards. These annual awards recognize individuals, groups and organizations in our community who have made significant contributions to human rights efforts in Kitsap County.

Awards are made in four categories: Youth, Adult, Program/Organization and Lifetime Achievement. The basic criteria for selecting Wall of fame recipients are:

- Individuals and groups who are long-time contributors to human rights and diversity issues in Kitsap County, i.e., those living, working or providing services in Kitsap County for two to five years.
 - Individuals or groups who have made significant contributions to human rights and diversity issues in Kitsap County in the areas of, but not limited to:
 - Community
 - Religious/Spiritual Affiliation
 - School
 - Family
 - Civic Organizations
 - Work Place
- “Significant” meaning efforts that have extended beyond obligations related to job performance and duties “as assigned” if in a paid position. Contributions that have benefited the larger community.

Specific award criteria include:

Youth or Adult Categories:

- Individual is affiliated with organizations that support diversity, human rights and positive change. List name of organizations, number of years involved and type(s) of activities.
- Individual’s involvement has made a difference to the people and communities served, i.e., type of impact, different groups impacted, amount of time invested and role modeling behavior.

Program/Organization Category:

- Communities impacted by service
- Type of impact
- Collaboration with other organizations
- Amount of time invested
- Role modeling behavior

Lifetime Achievement Category:

- Same criteria as above
- Long-term involvement

All 2009 Wall of Fame Award recipients will be honored at the 19th Annual Human Rights Conference on December 4, 2009.
