Boating Education Class

Kitsap County, Wash. – Autumn is just around the corner and some recreational boaters soon will be taking measures to winterize their boats against the upcoming effects of La Niña.

With less than ideal boating weather soon to arrive, it's also a good opportunity to schedule that boating education class that's now required by state law.

Beginning Jan. 1, 2010 any boat operator, 30 years of age or younger, must have a mandatory Boater Education Card in their possession when operating a recreational power vessel of 15 horsepower or greater while on Washington's waterways.

Boaters are encouraged to attend a boating education class as soon as possible, and not wait until they are contacted by a marine patrol law enforcement officer to think about obtaining this required training and card.

The Kitsap County Sheriff's Office Marine Services Unit is offering an opportunity to attend a boating education class.

The class consists of eight hours of instruction that covers basic boating knowledge, to include: rules of the nautical road, vessel equipment, boat trailers, launching, emergencies, navigation aides & lights and terminology.

Successful completion of the class includes passing a 75 point examination. Once the Boating Education Card is obtained, it's good for life.

Boating Education Class Schedule

Date & times: Saturday, Oct. 2, 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

Location: Long Lake Community Center (Bob Oke Community Room), 5448 Long Lake Road SE, in South Kitsap. Class attendees are encouraged to bring their lunch.

Fee: \$10 to cover the cost of the Boating Education Card.

The below chart is a phase-in schedule for obtaining the mandatory Boating Education Card. The card requirement was started Jan. 1, 2008 and is being phased-in through 2014. Boaters born before Jan. 1, 1955 are exempt from this law.

Year (Jan. 1)	Age group
2010	30 years and younger
2011	35 years and younger
2012	40 years and younger
2013	50 years and younger
2014	59 years and younger
After 2014	Card is required for any boater born on or after Jan. 1, 1955
