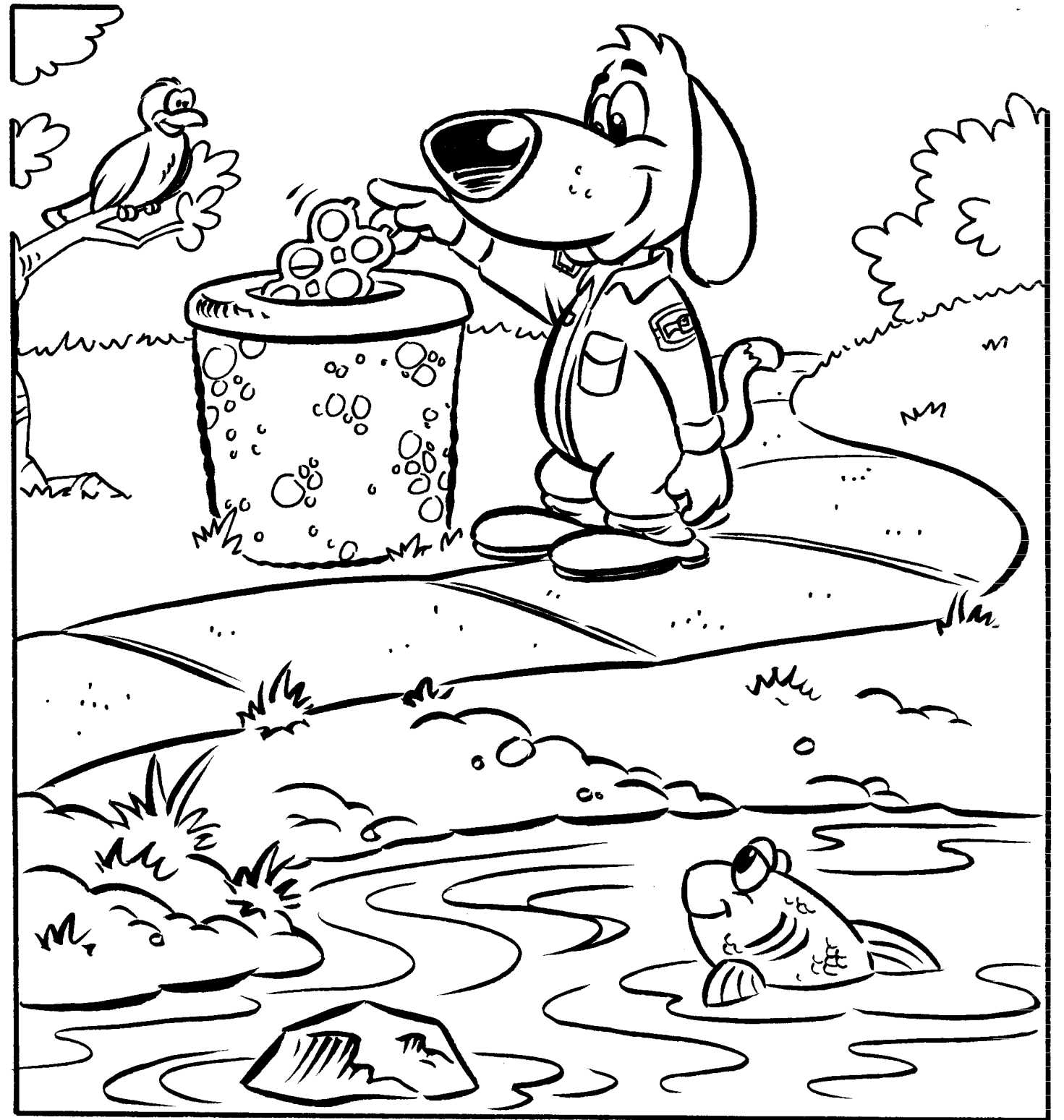

YOU CAN HELP YOUR ENVIRONMENT



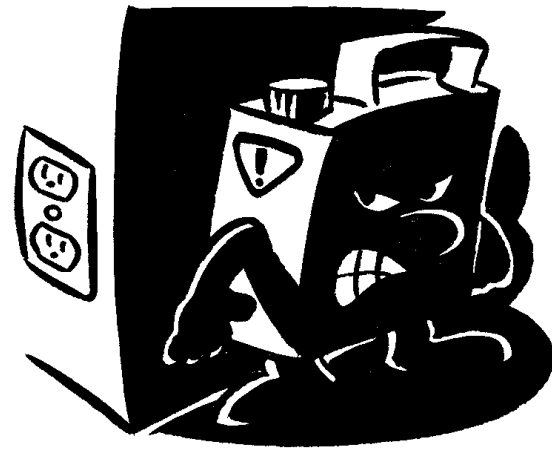


Recycling is a great way to save natural resources, energy, money, and landfill space. Instead of throwing things into the garbage can, put them into the recycling bin.

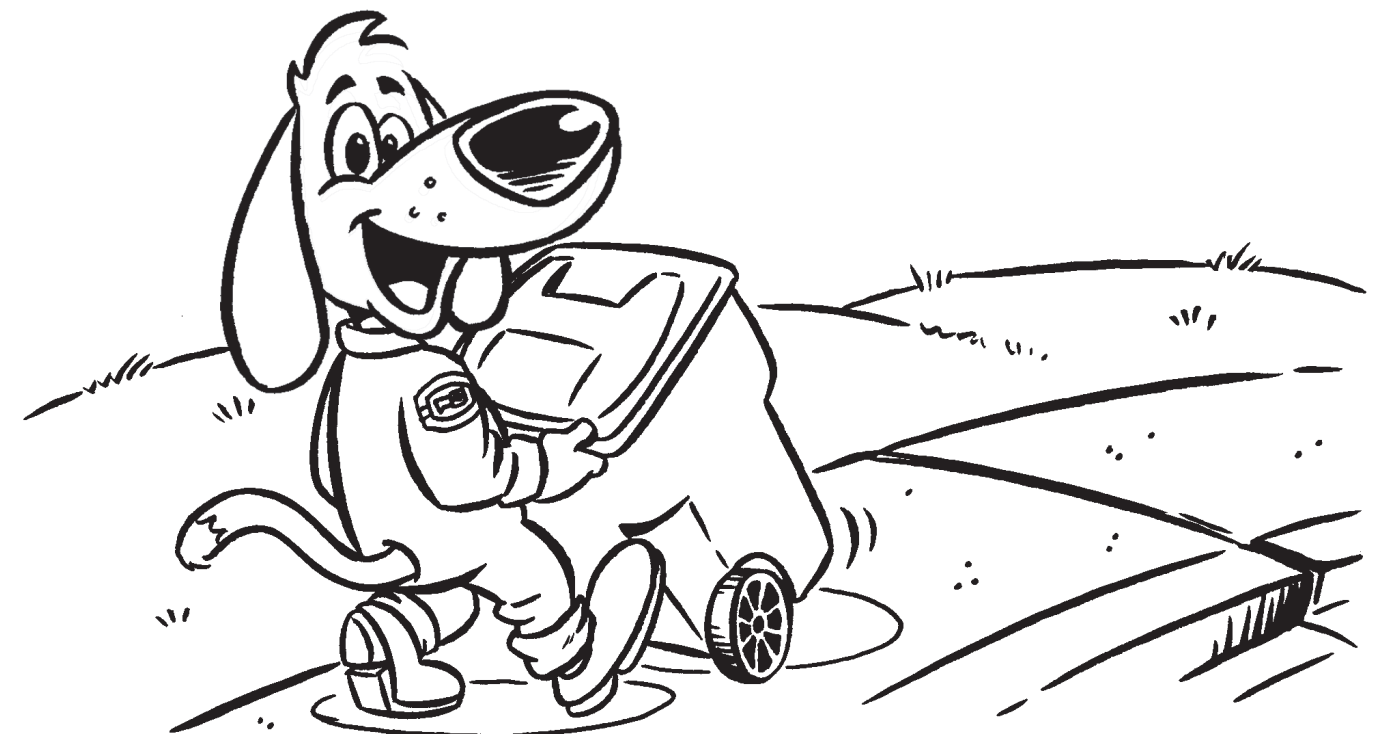

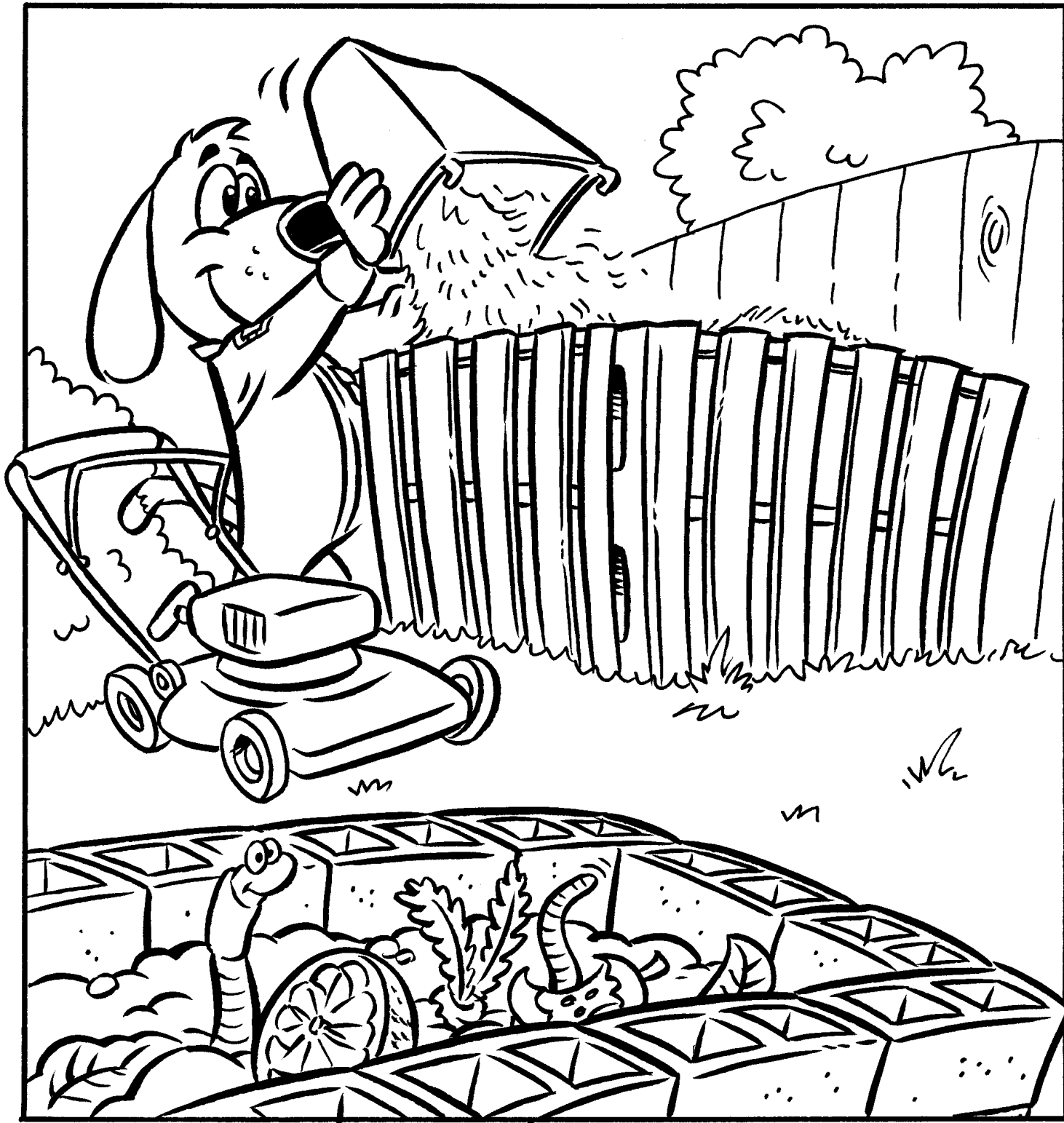
