**KCPWSWD – Dean Boening**

- Dean is preparing a Planning Interlocal Agreement between the County and Cities for the Comprehensive Plan, and is planning to attend city council meetings to discuss the planning process.
- He introduced Tamara Gordy with URS.

**URS CORPORATION – Tamara Gordy - An update on the Comprehensive Plan**

- Tamara presented an overview of the process for the Comprehensive Plan.
- A FTP website for members has been established to review chapters, provide input and view updates to the plan.
- URS will be guiding staff and helping with the process.
- The consultant team includes Tamara with URS, Herrera Environmental Consultants who will guide the development of waste reduction program and options, and Bell & Associates that specialize in all costs associated with solid waste programs. Dean will be the staff project manager.
- Cost effective long-range programs is a current issue.

- Some new issues to consider are emissions and diversion of organics and construction waste.
- Tamara suggested the Solid Waste Division's annual report as a resource.
- Information and rules for using the FTP site will be sent out.

- Poulsbo residents are pleased with the single stream recycling program.
- The residents would like to see the land-clearing burn ban put in place this year.

### **Kitsap County Health District – Grant Holdcroft**

- The single stream program is working exceptionally well.
- The Lake Symington area has been added to curbside service.
- North Kitsap School District currently has curbside service now, Bremerton will soon and SK School District begins February 1.
- The trains have been running on schedule at OVTS.
- In December there was 1,375 tons of residential curbside recycling processed. This is an increase of 500 tons per month.

- The Poulsbo residents like the single stream recycling curbside program.
- Single stream will begin on Bainbridge Island April 1.
