Waste Management – George Thompson

- Rail service was affected during the snow, WM is now back on schedule
- Repairs will be made to the tipping floor in March
- WM has begun the E-Cycle program and staff does the shrink wrapping
- Total Reclaim provides the pallets and gaylord boxes

Bainbridge Disposal – Dave Stanley

- E-Cycle program going smoothly with 19 pallets filled the first week, 15 pallets the second week, and 17 pallets the third week
- The participation numbers were tracked for the curbside recycling program the month of January; with Bainbridge Island's participation at 82.5%, and Poulsbo at 75.5%
- The sharps program is slow, but steadily building
