Central Kitsap – John Poppe No report

Kitsap County Health District – Jan Brower

- Jan read through highlights of the 2008 Annual Update

Navy – John Lacy

- New construction projects will now have specific plans written into the documentation of the project for continued recycling and solid waste operations, as part of a LEED standard
- The recycling program for Kitsap naval installations (non-residential) will be expanding to a two-cart recycling system (beverage containers and mixed paper) which will add 600 carts

City of Bremerton – Paul Lucas

- Negotiations on a new contract with Waste Management have begun. The current Waste Management contract expires in 2010
- The City may establish a Solid Waste Utility to begin billing customers

Waste Management – George Thompson

- Tonnages have remained the same;
- E-cycling numbers remaining steady at about 15,000 lbs per month
- Floor repairs were made with a metal-concrete material used mainly for tipping floors

City of Poulsbo – Denise Bauman

- A section of Highway 305 will be temporarily closed for two weeks in September to install fish culverts (Denise later notified the Solid Waste Division the City Council voted to delay this project until next summer)

Commercial – Rebecca Ascencio

- The recycling program in the district is gradually increasing
- The district is very pleased with New Day Recycling

KCPWSWD – Tamara Gordy

- Commissioner Bauer toured the recycling and garbage facility at Hansville this afternoon and has expressed interest

KCPWSWD – Cheryl Lutes

- Cheri Eaton will resign her position on the committee and move to Oklahoma in June
- The invitations have been mailed for the Volunteer Recognition Event April 21

KCPWSWD – Pat Campbell

- The Earth Day Awards ceremony will be April 13 at the Board of Commissioner’s regular Monday evening public meeting
- There are two upcoming Yard Waste Amnesty Day events; April 18 at North Mason Fiber Co. and April 26 at Emu Composting Facility
- There are several educational events scheduled around Earth Day
- Staff is starting to plan for a Bainbridge Island HHW collection event

Bainbridge Disposal – Dean Church

- E-cycle numbers have remained steady since the beginning of the program
- The sharps and compact fluorescents collection is going smoothly
- Constantly working to stop local contractors that hire companies to haul recyclables mixed with garbage out of the County

Bainbridge Disposal – Dave Stanley

- Hauling of food waste for both Town & Country and Central Market will begin next week

North Kitsap – Kinley Deller – No report.
