## **KCPWSWD – Tamara Gordy CSWMP Public Involvement Strategy**

- The new title for the Plan is “Waste Wise Communities – The Future of Solid Waste Management in Kitsap County”
- BKAT conducted random interviews at the Futures Festival for advertising purposes
- The purpose for a Public Involvement strategy includes:
  - Educating interested members of the public
  - Creating opportunities for the public to offer suggestions
  - Supplying feedback to the Board of Commissioners
  - Developing a contact list of people interested in solid waste management issues
- An online form to sign up for information regarding solid waste management is on the Solid Waste website
- A draft should be released to the Public Works Directors within two weeks time

## **KCPWSWD – Pat Campbell**

- Applications for the Organics position were reviewed.
  - Paul Lucas nominated Bob Dressel to fill the position. Dave Stanley seconded. John Lacy abstained from voting.
  - The motion was approved to recommend Bob Dressel to the SWAC with the caveat that Bob is contacted to assure the committee that he will be able to attend the regular scheduled meetings
- A handout of the Coordinated Prevention Grant application was reviewed
  - The application will also be sent for review by the cities’ Public Works Directors
  - Ecology requires a detailed quarterly spending plan with all applications

## **ROUND TABLE**

### **Bainbridge Disposal – Dave Stanley**

- The multi-family program is going strong and the toters are being delivered
- The Suquamish Tribal event (The Journey) has generated over 2 tons of compostable materials and 20 cubic yards of recycled materials in a two day period. There is one 10-yd container on site for garbage that has not yet been filled

### **City of Bremerton – Paul Lucas**

- The City is partnering with PSNS for the upcoming West Sound Safety and Health event

### **Waste Management - George Thompson**

- Waste Management delivered toters to the City of Port Orchard for the downtown painting event
- Toters are being delivered to the participants of the Multi-family program

### **Navy – John Lacy**

- A back-up camera was retro fitted into the bumper of a hook lift truck at the Everett facility for better visibility and safety

### **Commercial – Rebecca Ascencio**

- There has been an increase in illegal dumping found at several of the District's dumpsters

### **KCPW-SWD – Pat Campbell**

- The Food To Flowers program will be expanding to another five schools in the SKSD for the upcoming school year. Staff will track the data to share with the other Kitsap school districts
- Staff has met with the Bremerton Housing Authority regarding possible financial assistance with the West Park housing de-construction project
- A mobile collection event is scheduled for September 19 on Bainbridge Island

### **KCPW-SWD – Tamara Gordy**

- The first shipment of sharps collected over a two-year period weighed 3.5 tons
- An increase in illegal dumping has been noted at the RAGFs
- There have been a number of break-ins at the RAGFs
