**ESTABLISHMENT:**

Kitsap County created the Council for Human Rights in 1989 following a cross burning incident. Its purpose and functions are affirmed in Resolution 451-1994.

**RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Function as part of a team. Provide information and advice to the Kitsap County Board of Commissioners and citizens on issues related to discrimination, malicious harassment, and physical violence based on race, age, economic status, religious beliefs, physical challenges, mental challenges, gender, sexual orientation, or national origin. Promote awareness and equitable treatment of all citizens. Reduce prejudice through public forums, education and other activities. Co-sponsor the annual Human Rights Conference.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

Must live in Commissioner District #1. Must be a Kitsap County resident who is willing and able to attend monthly meetings and other council functions. Must be willing to support the County's long-term goals and support the mission and goals of the Council for Human Rights.

**MEMBERSHIP:**

The Kitsap County Board of Commissioners appoint up to twelve voting members, reflecting a broad range of ethnic, religious, cultural, educational, and civic groups. Members are volunteers who serve without compensation.
