Administrative Items

Representatives from the Fuel Depot made a presentation. Glenn Schmidt, Ed Nixon, Brian Davis and others.

Glenn started with a history of the Fuel Depot. This is the largest Department of Defense fuel storage in the U.S. It is also the major response center for spills in this region.

Proposed Project: They will replace underground tanks with larger above ground tanks (more cost effective). This will be done in 3 stages and will take about 6 years to complete. The first stage is the proposal which must be approved by Congress. Congressional approval should take place in 2020. The design contract has been awarded. Cost will be \$2million for construction and \$60 million for decommissioning of old tanks. Construction might begin mid year 2021.

The project itself cannot pay for off-site improvements. There will be up to 100-200 contractors per day working on the project. There will be about 15 large trucks running per day. Routes for the trucks is being investigated. Beaver Creek is NOT the best route, Colchester is preferred. They will look into using water route for moving materials (but probably to expensive and prohibitive with environmental regulations).
