OLD BUSINESS

- Inclusionary Zoning Request Status
  - No County plan to address it unilaterally
  - Kitsap Regional Coordinating Council (KRCC) discussion is looking into inclusionary zoning and affordable housing options
  - Mary asked if someone from the Affordable Housing attend
- Norman Road Access to the NK Heritage Park
  - Mark summarized the context and indicated that we haven't heard back about the County's plan to make that entrance more formal and useful for horses, etc.
  - Jennifer spoke to C. Gelder and they have an estimate 6 year parks planning budget planning for \$193K. Jim Dunwitty (County Parks Director) has been communicating with the park stewards. Joe Lubischar on April 5th is the point for the stewards and could establish a work party.
