Carrilu Thompson moved to approve the January minutes, Paul Nuchims seconded and the vote passed unanimously.

Members discussed the impacts of Jenny Bloom leaving Kitsap Regional Library. Ray Pardo said to contact the director of Kitsap Regional Library, Jill Jean for more information.

Commissioner Charlotte Garrido shared that the county is working to start the process of rebuilding the Kitsap County Courthouse.

Scott Billingsley and Denise Burbidge rose inquiries about the Tiny Home Village.

Kari Corey and Carrilu Thompson shared information gained at the Department of Community Development workshop. There was lots of discussion and questions about the workshop and zoning laws it affected. Carrilu Thompson covered four main topics from the workshop. The four topics were minimum lot sizes, residential vs. commercial zoning, accessory dwelling units and benefits of building on old property rather than new.

Paul Nuchims brought up concerns about the Fuel Depot project. Representatives from there will be at the open house, so it was suggested he bring his questions up there.
