

Suquamish Citizen Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes

PROCEEDINGS

Meeting began at 6:08 PM.

Public Comment None.

April and May minutes were postponed to July.

Meeting Core

Suquamish Police were not available for an update at this meeting.

Tina Nelson was offered an opportunity to provide any updates that may be applicable and she noted that the next Suquamish project is next year with the sidewalks from Division to Suquamish. Otherwise County focus is toward other projects as delineated by the TIP.

Tom C. lead a discussion regarding teaming up to take care of the parks as the foliage is growing quickly. Tom C. volunteered to provide a beginning mow on Hemphill Road End, Sports Court had no volunteer although Brian would work with the Garden Club to care for it. Thornton P. is focused toward Angeline Park, and April has volunteered to support Pathway Park by the school. A park bench at Hemphill was proposed by Tom and Thornton P. recommended approaching the Rotary to see if they would volunteer to place one. Thornton P. is coordinating with KC Parks (Lori Rainmaker) to repair the fence and repair sprinkler valves (a community work party will be formed to address those construction/maintenance events). The Garden Club is also examining options to get a metered water source to care for the plants (as well as a possible water fountain for sports court users).

Tom C. related to April F. that there is movement towards an all-abilities park and he will provide his information to her via Email so she can move forward.

Updates:

- James ST Road End update (Will M.): Coordinating construction with neighboring sewer construction. Expectation is to begin construction on/after June 13. There is also examination of a possible public right of way at Winfred (north of the school)
- Suquamish Merchants Association update (Thornton P): Thorn related that the local business survey was underway and example of the postcard was provided for attendee

viewing.

- Kitsap Transit has a survey available online and a consultant is helping them work toward service improvement. Tom C. highly recommended taking the survey.
- Jennifer Haro discussed that Commissioner Gelder was involved with coordinating discussion around the Route 104 corridor into the ferry. Tom C. also discussed a similar Route 305 study to improve traffic flow on and off Bainbridge during rush hours.

Final public comment: Will M. provided an update on the Cowling Creek feasibility study (as Paul Dorn discussed in March), and the study determined a bridge will be the chosen means to support the creek restoration.


Brian A. let the SCAC know that the Kitsap Chordsmen are putting on a show at the North Kitsap Auditorium July 15th.
