

**Suquamish Citizen Advisory Committee Meeting Minutes**

**PROCEEDINGS**

Meeting began at 6:08 PM.

Public Comment Tom C. reminded the meeting about the Friends of Miller Bay presentation coming later in November.

Brian A. Reminded the community about the West Sound Chorus holiday show on the 15th of December, and the Come Sing With Us Chorus.

September and October minutes were approved.

Meeting Core

Suquamish Police were not available for an update at this meeting. There were concerns about speeding and signage recommendations in Suquamish (some note about speeding at Augusta and other locations - Tom stated he would let the Police know).

Jeff S. (KCPW), discussed the effectiveness of speed radar signs. He began with the "Traffic Calming Program" (e.g. speed bumps) and how they get installed and the challenge/controversy that exist with their installation. He then discussed the speed radar signs that both observe and collect data. His research indicated that the signs DO tend to result (80-90% of the studies) in the desired speed being observed - even across time (he used Augusta's measurements as an example). The signs are seen as effective and are expected to continue to be effective.

Commissioner Gelder walked through Suquamish to examine road quality, unruly vegetation growth, narrow roads, and how these factors relate to pedestrian safety and safe routes to school.

The 2019 Work Plan was reviewed and changes were made. Approval will be sought during next month's meeting.

Updates:

- James ST Road End update (Tom C.): The Suquamish Garden Club has agreed to support as the 501-3c repository for the Appendix X Grant when it is provided. There are some efforts to do preliminary improvement and the current plan is being shared with the County to ensure requirements are met for planning.
