**PROCEEDINGS**

Meeting began at 6:04 PM.

Public Comment

There was no public comment at the start of the meeting.

February minutes were approved.

Meeting Core

Assistant Chief Almirol, briefly discussed the shooting that took place a month ago in Suquamish (the first in approximately ten years), as well as the disposition of property in the local area that had recently become vacated and boarded up. There was also discussion (related to a local concern with neighbors that are in and out of incarceration) as to whether the police had recommendations as what might be the best siding for protection from possible errant weapons discharge. Assistant Chief Almirol understood the concern to protect their families but unfortunately had no recommendations to the community. There was a reminder (with associated business card that had Police Tip Information Email: [police\\_narcotics@suquamish.nsn.us](mailto:police_narcotics@suquamish.nsn.us); and online reporting <http://www.kitsap911.org/report.htm>) that if you have information for the police (e.g., a picture of a suspicious license plate) you can use Email or internet to provide those to the Suquamish Police Department. Pet control was discussed as a concern, and speeding was discussed as a concern and Asst. Chief stressed that the bulk of the school year presence is supporting enforcement during school hours. There are no large crime sprees for concern but we still experience crime in unlocked cars and homes. Remember to lock up. Also discussion reinforced - if you need Police or Fire support, call 911 EVEN IF IT'S NOT AN EMERGENCY. If you have a question or concern for the County - KITSAP 1 is the best method to get support.

Tina N. (KC PW) was present to provide subject matter expertise for County policies, missions and process responsibilities. discussed roads and vegetative management concerns of the SCAC. Kevin McD. Reinitiated discussion based on discussion and clarifications provided during the last meeting and the solutions offered were to modify a County community engagement flyer/educational campaign and to engage Kitsap Transit and the local Schools to help identify vegetation that may impact transit safety

(obscurations, etc.). The overriding goal being to ensure a safe walkable community. SCAC future agenda for the year was brainstormed. Lisa L. and Laurie K. Volunteered to help setting the meeting agendas for the coming year.

Updates:

- James ST Road End update (Tom C): Tom felt the Garden Club was hesitant at this point to provide support at this point as the Grant backer. Discussions are ongoing.
- PTSA Update (Kevin McD): The PTSA had recent challenge with storm water and school ball field flooding. SCAC will engage KC PW Stormwater and the PTSA to assist in finding a solution to this issue.
- Transit Update (Kevin McD.): No update this month.
- Short Term Vacation Rental Ordinance (Jennifer C.): The County is still conducting public outreach on this topic. More to follow related to best practices and policy options after the team briefs the County Commissioners on the topic.
