PROCEEDINGS

Meeting began at 1807.

Meeting Minutes for October and November were approved.

Public Comment

Kitsap Chordsmen have their Christmas show this Saturday.

Thanks to Allan, Martha, Tom and other community members for their efforts on cleaning up leaves prior to the storms. An extensive discussion of County street sweepers followed and that will likely be a February meeting discussion item.

Martha noted there might be concerns with traffic and parking for the Kitsap Transit Fast Ferry that will impact Suquamish.

Meeting Core

Officer Tom Nance provided community update about a local crime wave for the last three weeks (increase in burglaries) locally [almost a burglary a day, with heavy reporting on weekends]. He reminded the SCAC to document serial numbers for your valuables. The homes and sheds are forced entries and normally during the day. Remember at Christmas to watch out for your package deliveries. If you are a victim, look at E-Bay, or Craigslist, or Offer Up as where your valuables may be getting sold. If there is concern regarding speeds in your part of Suquamish (e.g., Soundview) contact Tom C. and he will ensure the Suquamish CopShop knows and possibly will allocate tools to help enforce speed limits in your area.

SCAC Work Plan for 2018. The work plan was updated and was approved. This document guides our projects and direction for next year, and an evaluation of how we've done this year.

SCAC Officer elections. Tom Curley, Megan Hale and Brian Albro have volunteered for the same positions, and been affirmed by the SCAC quorum present for another year.

Community Expectations letter. Kevin M's letter was read to the audience present. It highlighted concerns regarding service levels (both from Kitsap County and Kitsap

Transit) and what might be the role of the Tribe in caring for roadways and walkways.

- James ST Road End update (Tom C.): Bruce G. and Tom C. are building the planning now for the final push.
- Division Avenue North Trail. Dick D. and Paul both provided updates on moving forward engaging local bicycling groups and groups that will conduct trail cleaning.
- Transit update was provided during discussion regarding the Community Expectations letter.

Bruce G. requested update on what's going on downtown.

Meeting was concluded at 2012.


