PROCEEDINGS

Meeting began at 6:05 PM.

Public Comment. Allen J. asked what are the rules for driving ATVs to the gas station on roads during snowstorms? Jennifer H. volunteered to provide answers to his questions.

January minutes were approved.

Meeting Core

Suquamish Police were not available for an update at this meeting.

Planning for upcoming 'Celebrate Suquamish' community gathering took place.

Updates:

- PTSA Update: They have started movie nights in the gym on Fridays at 6:30. March 14th (6-9 PM) there is a Roaring 20's Auction Fundraiser at the Indianola Clubhouse with entertainment.
- Vegetation Update (Kevin M.): There was a County tractor in Suquamish that did a great job cleaning up recently.
- Suquamish Cleanup (Tom C.): Scheduled for April 25th from 9-to-noon, meet at the UCC.
- Map Your Neighborhood planning meeting 2/29 at House of Awakened Culture (Tom C): 10-noon, come if you are interested in neighborhood watch or any of those types of neighborhood activities.
- County Online Permitting (for addressing) – observations (Tom C): Recently Tom C. attempted to establish a local address for a local landmark. Suffice to say the online process was challenging (unusable) and Tom had to reach a person to make the connection.
- Totten Road walkway project update (Commissioner Gelder and Tom C): The Project was reliant on a large Federal Grant (timing for the spending is critical), and newly discovered challenges related to easements and electrical power poles that had to be moved (based on Federal Law) caused the plan to come apart. Bottom line, it's a tough time for transportation funding and this project has now been put on hold.

- Update on Fern and Division camping property (Tom C): The tents and trailers are now gone.
- Highway 305 - Suquamish Way roundabout update (Commissioner Gelder): The group of interested stakeholders (the County, WASH DOT, Bainbridge Island, etc.) met and there appears to be movement toward a solution for this intersection. There are other challenges that are presenting themselves in the overall plan (i.e., Day Road circle), but it continues to move forward.

Final public comment:

Tom C: Free Range Films is a local Indianola organization that shows culture and art films and is presenting at the UCC tomorrow night.


