Meeting Core

Suquamish Police. There were no updates from the Police.

Liz W. gave an overview of the upcoming Buildable Lands Analysis and Report (a monitoring document that feeds back to the Growth Management Act and informs as to whether corrections are needed in that Act). The presentation included discussion about how Public can participate in the process (details can be found on the Project website in the County DCD web pages). Also, Kirvie discussed the Shoreline Master Program which is required by the Shoreline Management Act. The goal is to ensure alignment and consistency with current code updates since the last review. The timelines for both reviews began in October 2020 and have to complete reporting by 30 June 2021. Details can also be found on this Project website in the DCD web pages.

SCAC by-laws were reviewed and approved with two changes to the original.

The SCAC Workplan was reviewed and approved with changes.

SCAC Officer elections for 2021 - Laurie and Martha were nominated and accepted as Co-Chairs to replace Tom C. Brian A. was reaffirmed as Recorder.

Update -

Discussion for an introductory SCAC Tribal statement. Proposal: "We acknowledge that the land on which we gather is within the aboriginal territory of the Suquamish people. We are grateful for the opportunity to share in the natural beauty of the Central Salish Sea and honor its people's history and traditions." The statement led to a great deal of discussion with multiple viewpoints. Tom C. has been asked to see if the wording has the desired impact with Tribal Council or if there are any recommendations from them related to the effort.

Hemphill Road-end cleanup. No new update.

TinyTown 2 update. The sites are being prepared now and are anticipated to be finished by June.

Final public comment:

Tom C. - if you can get the vaccine, please do it.


