PROCEEDINGS

Meeting began at 6:06 PM (the group worked through Zoom connecting from 5:50).

Public Comment.

Martha B. wanted to thank the Suquamish Tribe for the newsletter, it is informative and refreshing.

Ed M. noted that Steve Sackman (Garden Club Member) is interested in collecting fruit that may be ripening in your yards to give to the Kitsap Food Bank.

Paul P., someone ran into the split rail fence this weekend at Angeline Park (Harris side) and we need to get together to repair the three sections of the split rail fence. (County has for Action to get back with Tom C.)

August Minutes were approved.

Meeting Core

Suquamish Police were available and discussed traffic enforcement as a focus, there was also response for domestic violence. Martha B. wanted to thank our Suquamish Police for what they do in our community! Paul P. discussed an injury in our neighborhood for everyone's awareness.

Update -

Advertising signs in Suquamish that violate the Kitsap County sign code 17.510. Bruce G. discussed signage in our area that may or may not be legal based on the sign code and location. See-Click-Fix app for mobile devices and "Kitsap 1" are great methods to address these questions/concerns with the County. That being said, some of the election signage still up becomes problematic for removal and cleaning if the folks that put them up don't take them down.

Pathway/trail connecting Angeline Ave. NE through private property. At one point there were owners that supported a trail between Geneva and Union but there is not a clear legal delineation for the trail in the neighborhood as far as the County research can determine. Bruce G. is aware of a community member that is doing research with a Realtor. Parks (Martha B.). We confirmed that County Parks can support a meeting next month. There is concern about tree removal, and if there are some specific concerns Commis-

sioner Gelder recommended that the County Forester (Arno) also be a part of the discussion as well next month.

Census2020 Non-Response Follow-up update (Tom C). Things are going well but it is a challenge. Kitsap is doing well in our efforts.

Final public comment:

Martha B. mentioned that the Puget Sound Council was reported as passenger ferries in and around the Seattle Area and was surprised to see reporting (Kitsap Sun) that discussed Suquamish as a possible foot ferry site. Commissioner Gelder stated that there were discussions but feasibility did not appear to pass initial stages of consideration.


Tom C. provided a Tinytown 2 update and two new duplexes that are going up in the area.
