1. **QUESTION:** With regard to 2021-130-1.37 (pg. 7): The 1080p high resolution IP type camera is a common industry standard for interviews, and while a 550 line analog camera can offer very good images in a small room it is not compatible for easy viewing and playback on existing digital recording hardware. With this factor in mind, is a higher resolution (1080p HD) digital IP type camera acceptable as opposed to a 550 line camera?

ANSWER: Yes

2. **QUESTION:** With regard to 2021-130-1.39 (pg. 7): For technical reasons based on optimizing image quality with IP cameras our suppliers do not recommend the use of video baluns. Thus, would standard CAT-6 RJ-45 network cable connectors be an acceptable substitution for the noted four (4) high quality video baluns?

ANSWER: Yes

3. **QUESTION:** With regard to 2021-130-1.52 (pg. 7): Does the requirement for immediate file transfer not only include evidence management systems such as the brand listed but also include commonly used immediate local network File Transfer Programs to local storage assets?

ANSWER: Only the requirement for immediate file transfer.

4. **QUESTION:** With regard to 2021-130-1.34 (pg. 7): Does the “360 degree image” wording refer to a requirement for a true “fisheye” type 360 degree panoramic type lens view that is capable of viewing every corner of the room simultaneously? A typical PTZ camera is capable of traversing 360 degrees to view every side of the room. (Comparison photos of PTZ vs. Fisheye type images were previously attached and sent with this message but may have not transmitted properly.) In contrast, “fisheye” type images cover 100% of the room simultaneously but since they are optically



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distorted they usually require a special “dewarping” program for easier viewing not often supported by most interview recording systems. A PTZ camera also has a wide angle setting that would capture most if not all of the room simultaneously. Thus, would a remote controlled PTZ (Pan, Tilt, Zoom) type camera be acceptable as opposed to a true 360 degree “fisheye” type?

ANSWER: Fisheye is required, add in the usually required a special “dewarping” program.

QUESTION: With regard to 2021-130-1.37 (pg. 7): The 1080p high resolution IP type camera is a common industry standard for interviews, and while a 550 line analog camera can offer very good images in a small room it is not compatible for easy viewing and playback on existing digital recording hardware. ANSWER: Yes

7. QUESTION: Diagram of KCSO office showing distance between the existing interview recorder equipment room out to the desired second interview room. This is a room toward the reception area with a table and chairs inside that give it the appearance of a meeting or conference room.


ANSWER: Approximately 150 feet.

8. QUESTION: Confirmation that there is IT network connectivity between the SAU office building, the KCSO office building.

ANSWER: There is multi-mode fiber and network connectivity.

9. QUESTION: Is there a server room (a secured room with power and overall network connectivity) that is or can be shared by the SAU office and the KCSO Detective offices? This overall network connectivity to include the room described on the tour as the Detective Conference Room which contained a conference room table and a large screen TV.

ANSWER: Yes

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10. QUESTION: Given that there is this connectivity, what speed provided? This is classically measured in Gbps or Mbps.

ANSWER: 1Gbps

11. QUESTION: Given that there is this connectivity, and assuming a working partnership with IT management, is this existing infrastructure available for connectivity between end user workstations and a special function dedicated server and the recorder computer? This connectivity is not used for camera A/V traffic. In the solution that will be proposed, no Kitsap County network infrastructure is engaged in communicating camera/microphone audio video to the recorder.

ANSWER: Yes
