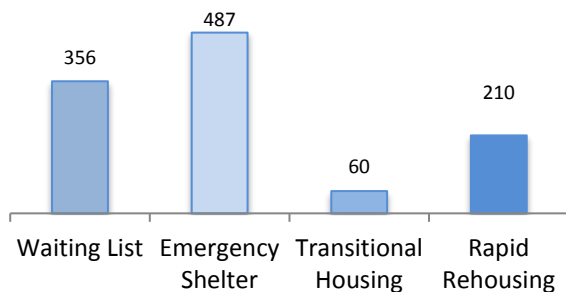

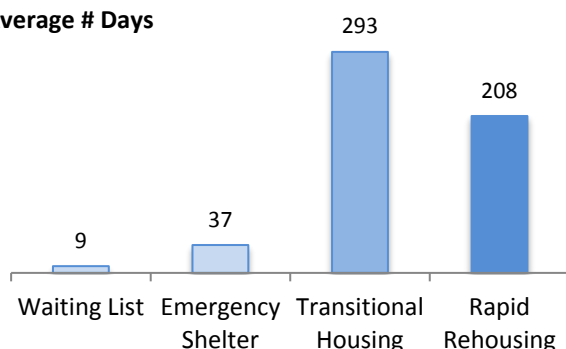

## TYPE & DURATION OF HOUSING

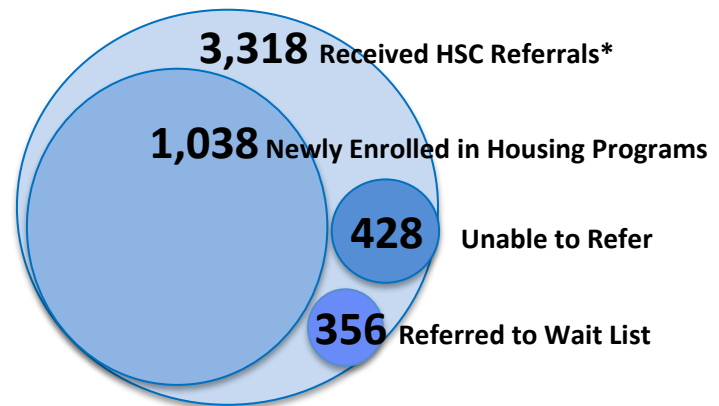

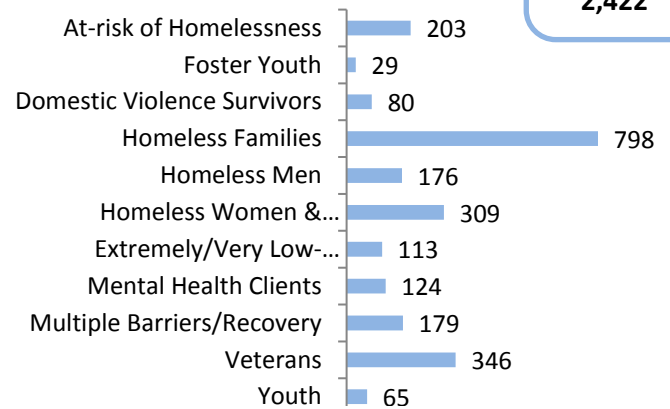
