BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF SOUTH PUGET SOUND South Kitsap Club Service Area: South Kitsap	45 Individuals	\$25,000
Funds will be used to support program operations at the South Kitsap Club. Operations include the wages and benefits of staff who deliver high-quality after school and summer programming for elementary-aged kids at Olalla Elementary School. Funds specifically support a portion of the staff costs of the Regional Manager, Branch Manager, Director of Family Services, Family Services Coordinator, Program Coordinator, and 3 Program Leaders. Majority of families served are at or below 80% Area Median Income.		
BREMERTON FOODLINE Food Bank Operations Service Area: Bremerton School District (outside city limits)	1,000 Individuals	\$30,000
Funds will be used for a portion of staff salary costs for foodbank operations at the Bremerton Foodline which provides emergency food assistance to those in need in the Bremerton School District boundary. Most clients served are at or below 30% Area Median Income. This funding supports Kitsap County clients outside the Bremerton City Limits.		
HELPLINE HOUSE BAINBRIDGE ISLAND Food Bank Operations Service Area: Bainbridge Island	1,200 Individuals	\$30,000
Funds will be used for a portion of the Food Bank Manager's salary for foodbank operations at Helpline House which provides nutritious food, available free of cost, to members of the Bainbridge Island community. In addition to providing food, clients can be referred to the Helpline House's social work team to assist with other services. Majority of clients served have incomes below 50% Area Median Income.		
SOUTH KITSAP HELPLINE Food Bank Operations Service Area: South Kitsap School District	4,800 Individuals	\$30,000
Funds requested will be used for a portion of the food bank Executive Director's salary to maintain and operate food bank services for low-income individuals residing or working in South Kitsap. The Executive Director and staff are directly involved in the daily operations of the food bank administration, inventory management, food distribution and deliveries.		
YMCA OF PIERCE AND KITSAP COUNTIES Child Care Scholarships Service Area: Central Kitsap and South Kitsap Schools	40 Individuals	\$30,000
Funds will be used to provide scholarships to enable children, ages 5 - 12, from low-income families to attend the YMCA's before and after school childcare program at school locations in Central Kitsap and South Kitsap School Districts. The program nurtures the development of children by providing a safe place to learn foundational skills, develop healthy and trusting relationships, and build self-reliance. Scholarships are typically a 30 to 50 percent discount off posted rates, often representing as much as a \$250 monthly discount. Families served are below 50% Area Median Income.
