



On Monday, November 21st, at about 3:00 pm, an Amazon employee was working in the 2900 block of Salmonberry Rd. The delivery driver had stopped to deliver a package in the area and when he returned to his van, he found an unknown male sitting in the driver's seat. The employee had climbed back into the van through a side door and before he could say anything, the unknown suspect accelerated, causing the Amazon employee to fall out of the van, before speeding away.

Deputies responded to the scene within minutes. As they were en route, another witness called in suspicious activity on a dirt road between Phillips Rd and Jackson Ave where a male wearing a ski mask and female were removing packages from an Amazon van and loading them into a U-Haul truck.

Deputies responded to this location but by the time they got there, the U-Haul truck was gone and the abandoned, and now emptied Amazon van, remained behind. Deputies processed the scene for evidence and interviewed the driver and witnesses who described the suspects as a white male wearing dark clothing and a face mask driving the Amazon van and a white female with blonde hair, dark clothing and a beanie cap driving the U-Haul truck.

The Amazon employee, a 66-year-old Bremerton man, suffered minor injuries after being thrown from the van and was treated at the scene and released.

At approximately 4:50 pm, Deputies were dispatched to the area of Lakeview Dr and Long Lake Rd for the now abandoned U-Haul truck seen in the area. Deputies found several empty Amazon totes around the truck. Deputies determined that the U-Haul truck had been stolen earlier in the morning from an address on Kitsap Way in Bremerton.

Detectives were able to secure video footage of the suspects involved in this incident. Below is a short video clip of the suspects loading packages from the Amazon van into the U-Haul truck.

The male is thin and wearing a black jacket, black baseball hat with an "R" on it, similar to Russell Athletics, and face mask. The male has very distinct hand tattoos. The female is a white female, heavysset in her 20's with blonde or auburn hair wearing a camouflage jacket, light colored beanie hat and dark face covering.
