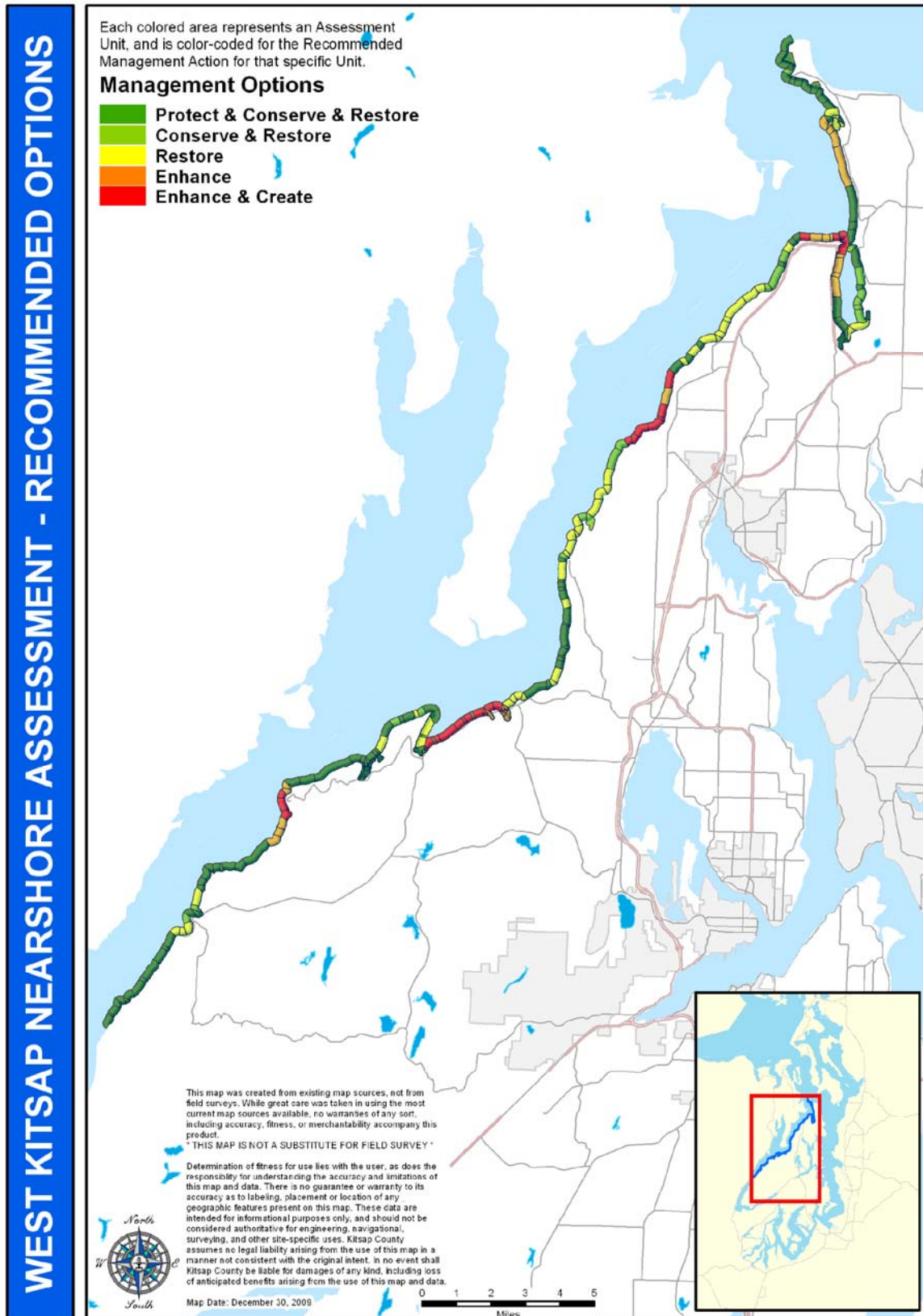
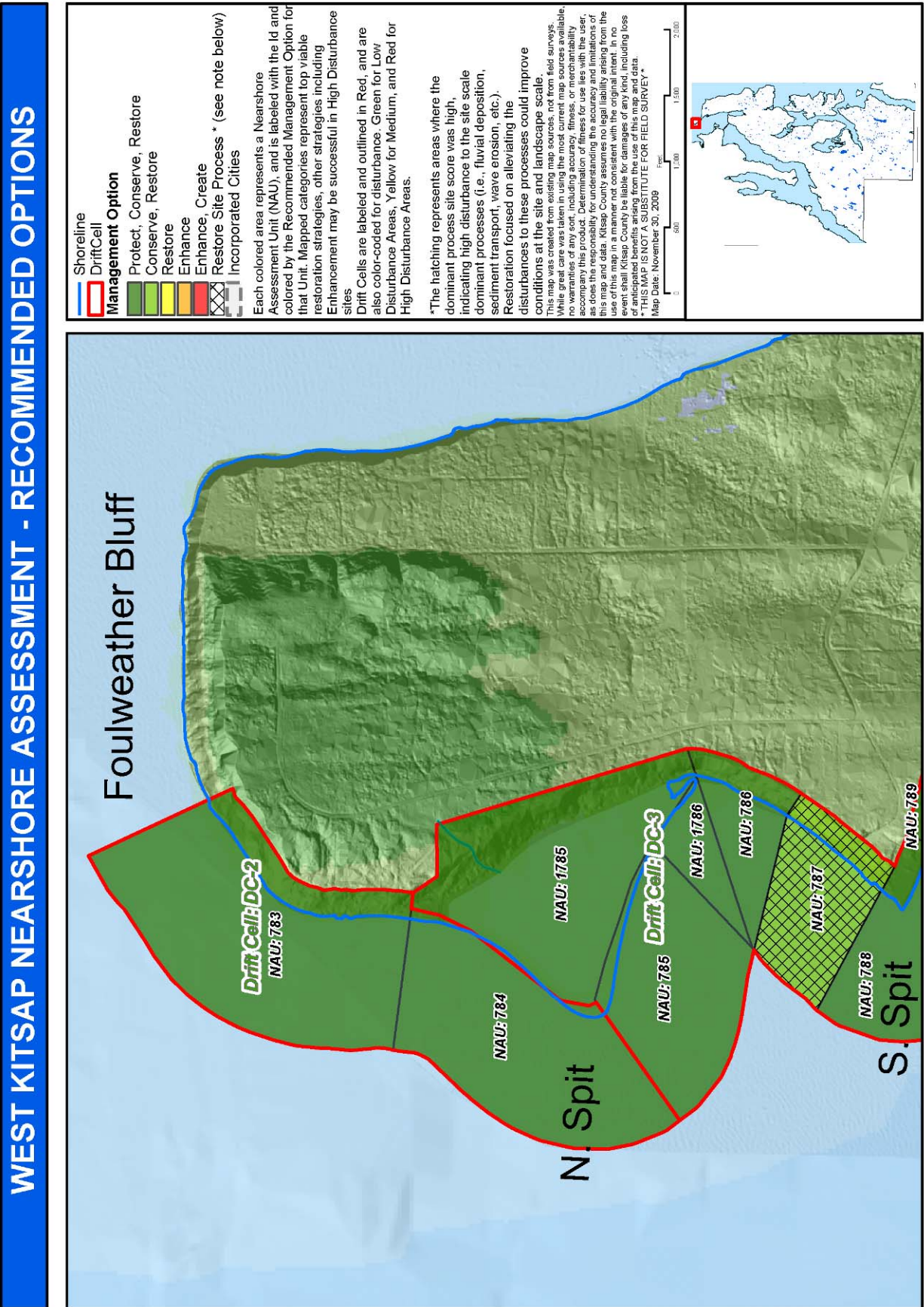



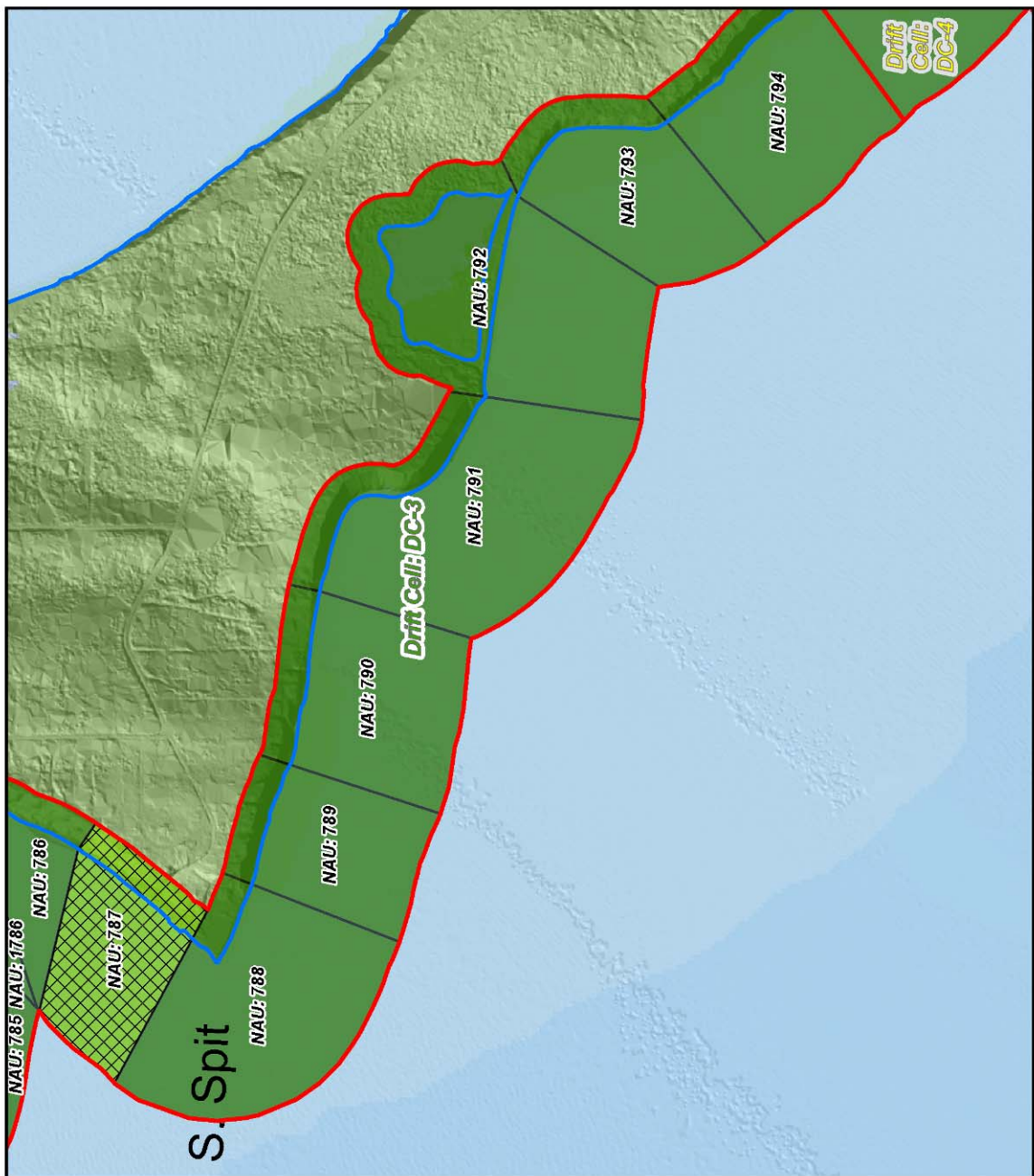
Figure D1. Overview map of recommended management options for the Nearshore Units
